

LGBTQ Elders: s America Needs Your Stories!

June 28th, 2019 marks the 50th anniversary of the Stonewall riots in New York City, a moment which marked the beginning of the national LGBTQ rights movement in the United States. To date there has been no national effort to document and preserve the experiences of everyday LGBTQ people in the era before Stonewall.

To honor this historic anniversary, the American oral history project StoryCorps is asking the country to record the stories of LGBTQ elders on the StoryCorps App. Each of these interviews will become a permanent part of American history at the Library of Congress.
